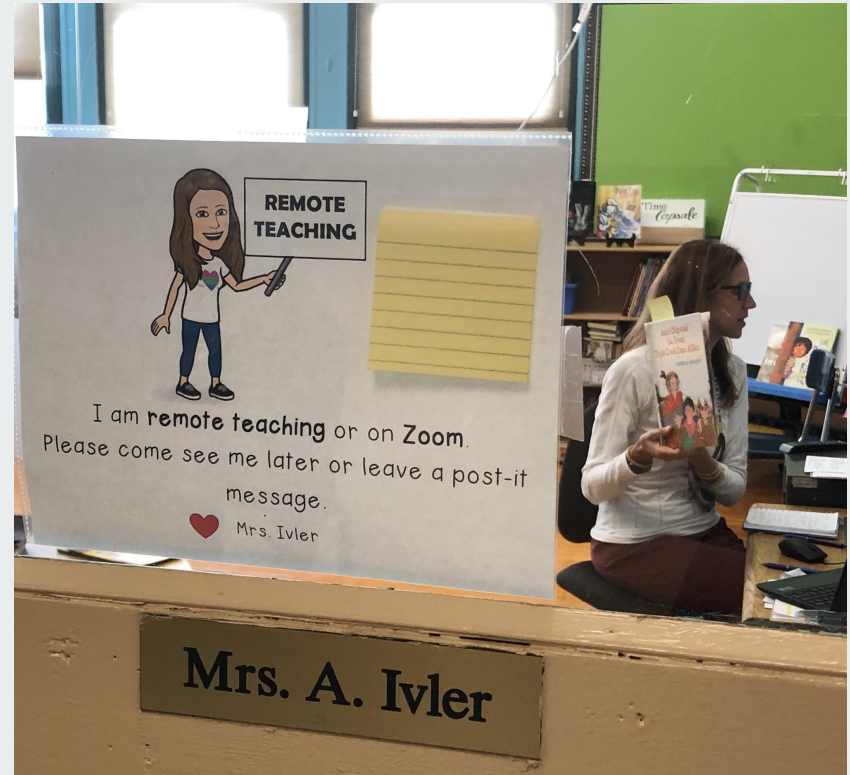
I know we talk a lot about books being windows and doors, but this pandemic has also shown us that books can also be shelters.

Sometimes you just need to live between covers for awhile, and I'm really glad to be in a business that creates that necessary space for people.

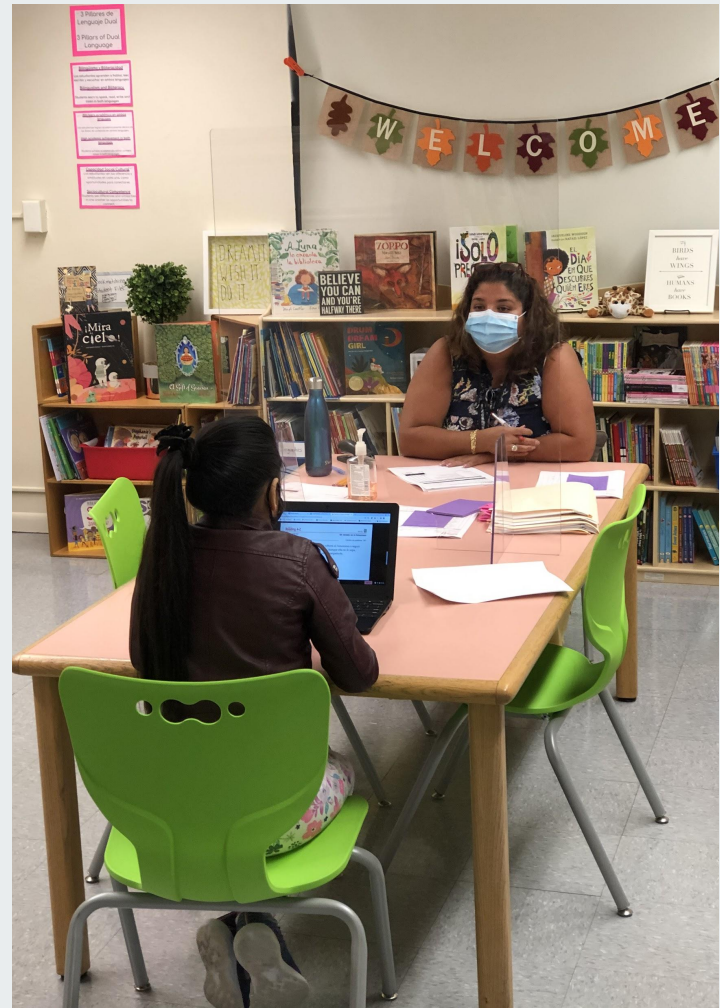


Fall 2020 Priorities

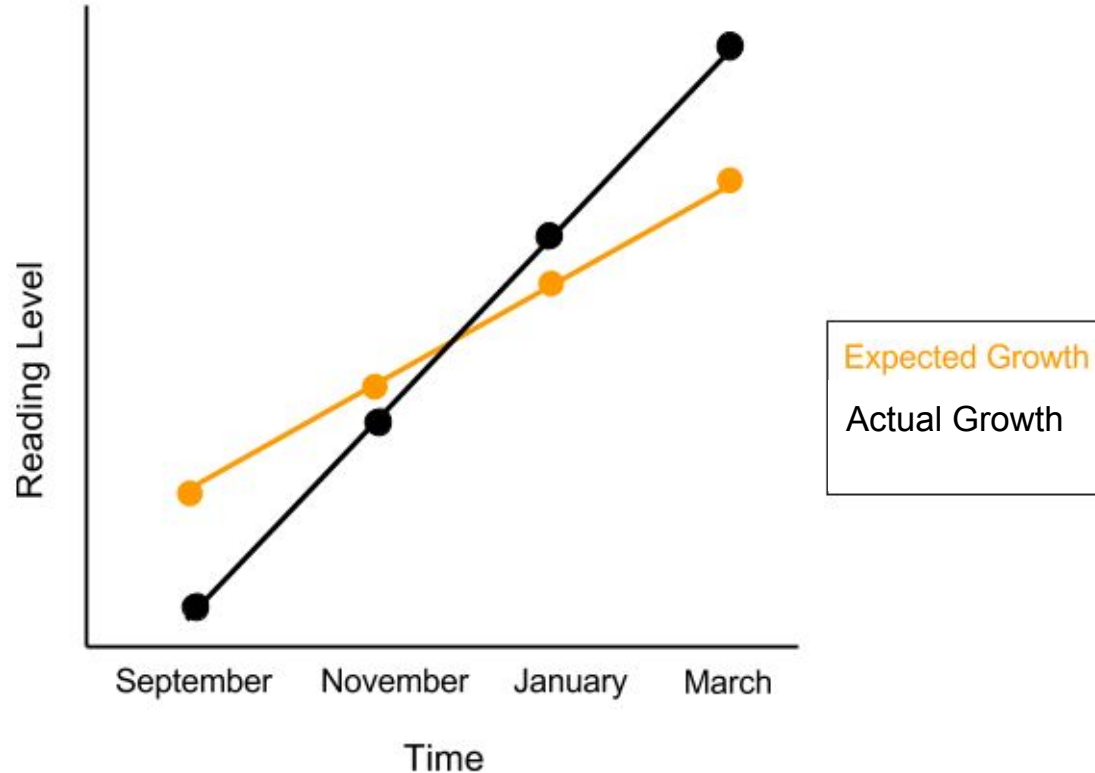
When we look at the increase in students reading at or above benchmark by pod type, we see

14% increase for students in **remote** pods

10% increase for students in **hybrid** pods

Across the district, by race, socio-economic status, and learning model, 10-14% more students have reached or exceeded proficiency since September.

Accelerated Reading Growth



Of the **791** kids who were below benchmark in October 2020,

58% (455) made accelerated gains

32% (252) reached or surpassed the benchmark

Of the **235** students in poverty learning in hybrid pods,
34% (82) made accelerated gains.

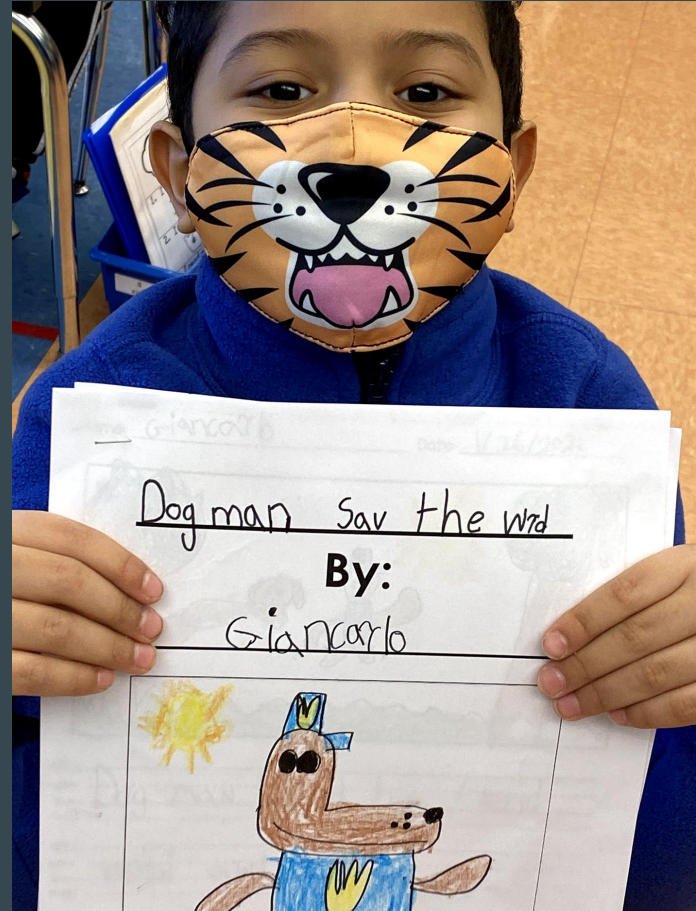
Of the **109** students in poverty learning in remote pods,
50% (54) made accelerated gains.

Reading Recovery Update

- Early literacy intervention delivered 1:1 to eligible first graders by specially trained teachers.
- Daily 30-minute lessons for 12-20 weeks.
- Overseen by regional director; data collected by International Data Evaluation Center at Ohio State University.
- Reading Recovery rated highest for overall reading achievement of all programs reviewed by What Works Clearinghouse.
- Mamaroneck has largest RR program in region outside NYC.



Reading Recovery Update--2020-21 School Year

- Current second graders who were eligible as first graders last spring were re-screened in the fall; all 26 slots were filled (23 second graders, 3 first graders).
- Most Reading Recovery lessons were delivered remotely.
